For generations, children and workers carried their noon meal in everything from animal skins to wicker, often finding shade beneath a tree or sitting on a schoolhouse stoop to eat. As industrialization grew, the metal lunchbox evolved into a symbol of class status. This lunchbox, now immortalized in resin, captures the essence of a moment in time and personal memory.
